#### **Development at Tralee and Environs**

I strongly disagree with development at Tralee and Environs. I feel that the Canberra Airport has been upfront and deliberate in stating their objection to the development, due to the high noise level that residents will be subjected to living directly under the flight path.

I can assure everyone involved that the noise level is intolerable, having lived in North Glenelg, a suburb of Adelaide. We were among houses bombarded with noise on a rotational basis and the disruption and sheer hell of living under a flight path is not to be underestimated. Not only is the noise so loud that you literally have to block your ears, the house shakes, the TV and radio go on the blink and life has to be suspended until the plane goes over. Try watching your favourite TV show, talk on the telephone or even hold a conversation under these conditions. This continues every few minutes on certain days until it becomes intolerable. Eventually we, like most of our neighbours, had to put the house up for sale.

Our situation was different to those residents who will buy in Tralee and Environs. We were not originally under a flight path but due to protests by residents under the flight path it was decided that our suburb had to take its turn under a rotational basis.

Canberra Airport has taken steps to keep the flight path clear of houses and I think they should be commended for their forward planning and thinking. Queanbeyan City Council, the New South Wales Government and opportunistic land developers are only thinking of the money they will make, not doing the right thing and thinking of the many people whose lives will be adversely affected. I see no reason why residents in other suburbs should be asked to share the noise pollution when it can be prevented by keeping the flight path clear.

Please do the right thing and reject the application for the development at Tralee and Environs.
