

STAGE 2 OPEN, STAGE 3 UNDERWAY

PERFECTLY TIMED FOR THE CENTENARY YEAR, STAGE TWO OF THE ALL NEW CANBERRA AIRPORT WAS UNVEILED ON 13 MARCH, 2013

Canberra Airport's \$450 million new terminal is all set to showcase a fresh new look for the Australian capital.

"What we are seeing is this airport is at least as good and arguably developing into the best in the country and that is a good thing for the national capital", said Infrastructure and Transport Minister Anthony Albanese at the opening.

Katy Gallagher said, "The terminal's public art is fabulous, the arrivals area is spacious, the departure lounges are comfortable and the indoor taxi rank will shelter travellers from the winter chill and unseasonal heat in autumn".

With the hard work of our dedicated partners and staff, the all new Canberra Airport, an important hub for corporate, government and leisure travellers will transform air travel and passenger experience.

THE STRIKING DESIGN OF THE NEW TERMINAL REFLECTS THE MODERN CITY OF CANBERRA, THE NATION'S CAPITAL

The city of Canberra has been inspirational to the team of specialists who have designed the terminal and its surrounds. An example of this can be seen in the main two level axial approach road to the terminal which reflects Anzac Parade.

KEY FACTS

- The Canberra Airport AirVolution started in 2009. The first phase, the Southern Concourse terminal, opened in November 2010.

- Stage 2 opened on 13 March 2013.
- Stage 3 is due for completion in November 2013.
- The terminal is 55,000 square metres, an increase from 12,000 square metres. That's four soccer fields.
- Four car parks with more than 3,000 car spaces within close proximity to the terminal.
- Currently more than 3 million passengers use Canberra Airport every year.
- Airline club and business lounges offer impressive views over the airfield along with state-of-the-art technology and comforts.
- Ten new passenger boarding bridges with floor-to-ceiling glass will allow passengers to look out on the airfield as they board.

KEY FACTS CONTINUED...

- The Atrium, centrepiece of the terminal has more than 700 windows and is three-storeys high (16m), designed to be an open and inviting space for departing passengers boasting magnificent views of the airfield and landscaped gardens in the front.
- Provision for check-in counters has increased from 16 to 44.
- The expanded apron will accommodate 16 narrow-bodied and four wide-bodied jets.
- The taxi rank at the airport will feature an indoor waiting area with televisions so passengers can wait for their transport in comfort.
- The airport transformation has created 1,200 construction jobs and will create an additional 300 ongoing jobs.
- 85% of all contractors and companies working at the airport are locally based.
- Two 650,000 litre water tanks are used to collect rain and ground water which is then used for irrigation and toilets.
- Water saving measures ensure the terminal will use between 20 and 30% less potable water than a conventional building.
- Tri-generation energy systems will reduce the terminal's carbon dioxide emissions by up to 75% over that of a conventional airport terminal. That's a 1331-tonne reduction in carbon emissions - equivalent to removing 350 cars from the road.

Stage 3, currently underway, involves ongoing work in the international zone along with demolition of the old terminal which will be replaced by two additional aerobridges.
